Meeting opened at 5.00pm

Attendees - 32 people from ACT, Victoria, NSW, Tasmania, SA, Queensland and WA attended. Shauna Phillips and David Staley attended via zoom.

Welcome - President John Sanderson welcomed sailors, their friends and family to the Australian Hansa Class National Championships 2022 incorporating the SA Hansa Class Championships.

Minutes – a copy of the minutes of the AHCA AGM held at Canberra Yacht Club on Friday 2nd April was supplied to the attendees.

President's report – John read out his report, a written copy of which was supplied to attendees.

Secretary / Treasurer's report – Shauna spoke on her report, a written copy was supplied to attendees advising that the membership remain the same, AHCA has a healthy bank account and since travel has now opened up and Asia Pacific Championships will be in Japan October this year. If anybody knows a friendly transport company please let her know.

- e. Terry Peek talked about the 2022 Asia Pacific Hansa Championships will be held in Hiroshima, Japan 18th 23rd October. David Staley said that this event will also include World Para Sailing Championships with sailor classification.
- f. Bob Schahinger 2023 World Championships will be held in Portimao, Portugal October 2023, entries are open on the IHCA website.
- g. Bob Schahinger 2025 World Championships may be held in New Zealand, to be confirmed.
- h. David Staley via zoom presented "World Sailing bid to reinstate sailing into LA28 Paralympic Games" and "How to support #BacktheBid". The two booklets were available to sailors and supporters.



i. Rules and Technical report – Bob Schahinger. Liberty rules were ratified by World Sailing, last year and came into force 1st December 2021. They were updated and re-written in a format that is preferred by WS in line with the Equipment Rules of Sailing. Currently 2.3 and 303 rules have been similarly revised and re-written and are being reviewed by WS. Hopefully they will be ratified by mid-2022.

Welcome all, I trust you are having a fun and eventful championship here in Wynyard. Thank you to Chris, Ela, Shauna and their team for their spectacular organisation.

I would like to thank Deidre, Bob and others for running a wonderful National Titles in Adelaide last Easter. Congratulations to the various national champions.

A team of our Australian sailors competed in Hiroshima Japan in the Asia Pacific Hansa Championships. Including; Chris Symonds, Manuela Klinger, Alison Weatherly, Alister Peek, Patrick McMaster, Bob Schahinger, Russell Phillips, Stacy Ford, Alice Anderson and Lachlan Clear. The last three are deaf sailors, one indigenous.

Last November David Staley ran and co-ordinated the World Sailing Virtus regatta in Southport for sailors with a cognitive impairment. One of the inclusive events that was hoping to assist in the Back The Bid campaign for LA.

Terry Peek ran a fun 25th Anniversary Regatta in the ACT.

Congratulations to all the sailors in their respective State and Para Championships.

Later this year in Oct 2023 the Hansa World Championships will be conducted in Portimao Portugal, hopefully I will see a few of you there.

Before this there is the 2023 Allianz Sailing World Championships featuring Para Sailing at the Hague.

Hansa Sailing features again in this coming Monday's ABC Australian Story. Mick O'Dowd , a quad amputee, who is sailing both servo 303 and a Liberty. This is a recap on a prior episode. Remember Chris Symonds has featured previously.

Secretary/ Treasurers Report

Great to see events getting more back to normal in the year 2022.

Last year, there was a Victorian, NSW and Tasmanian Hansa Class Championships along with the States/ Nationals in Adelaide at Easter.

As mentioned in several State reports, Hansa boats are being included in more open fleet divisions by mainstream clubs, which is great to see.

2022 also saw a SKUD 18 Championships in Sydney, with 7 boats taking part. An event for sailors with intellectual disabilities was held in Queensland through VIRTUS, however issues and costs for registering made it a small, yet very successful event.

Sail Melbourne in January is now regularly featuring Hansa 303, Liberties and SKUD18's as some of their invited classes. This is a world class regatta and sailors are encouraged to attend in order that the Hansa Classes continue to be invited!

Membership in the AHCA has suffered in the last few COVID years, but we were slowing seeing returning and new members over the last 2 years. With some State events not being held there is naturally a drop in membership in those states into 2023. Membership currently at 85.

The AHCA bank account on 1st January 2022 had \$37,514.30 and ended the year with \$40,711.58. With entries for the 2023 Nationals opening on December 12th, some of the entry fees from this year will be reconciled in 2023s financial statement.

Regatta fees and regatta expenses outstripped monies received (even including the 2023 fees) and, alongside refunds for sailors unable to travel to events saw the AHCA show a small loss for the year of \$102.72. However we are still in an excellent financial position.

Anyone planning to travel to the Worlds in Portimao will need to be a current financial member of the AHCA – I can provide proof, which will be required at registration.

We, alongside sailors of the world, were clearly disappointed with the decision to not include sailing in the Paralympics and we thank those within our Class and others around the World who tried to make that happen. That said, the Hansa Class is the gold standard for inclusion. You only have to look at this Nationals, where we have people from around the country, old, young, male, female, disabled and able bodied all just sailing. Regardless of the Paralympic decision, the Hansa fleets had their profiles raised in the last few years, and with growth in other counties – as well as our own – we should see the Class grow and thrive into the future.

Finally, it would be remiss to not acknowledge the passing in August last year of the legendary Barry Coates.

Thanks to Chris, Ella and Wynyard Yacht Club for hosting our Nationals in 2023.

2022-23 Report to the Hansa Class Association

Allister C Peek Canberra Yacht Club

We have a small fleet of Hansa boats at Canberra Yacht Club (CYC) with sailing on Sunday mornings and racing with a mixed fleet as a separate Hansa division.

We have not held a Hansa Dinghy Championship in the ACT for some time due to Covid and other reasons only 4 boat part in Dinghy Championship in November12 and 13 2022. We hold this Regatta as a part of the next ACT Dinghy Championship run by the CYC or the YMCA Sailing Club. The next Championship will be hold on November 2023 or 2024 in Dinghy Championship with an open class for Liberty, 303S and 303DD and 2.3S and 2.3DD.

We held a 'birthday bash' celebration in December 2022 for Sailability's <u>25</u> years of operation. Some 20 boats from clubs around NSW and Qld raced. It was fun see old friends and new. See you at the next 'birthday bash'.

We will hold the Friendship Cup in 2024 with sailors from around Australia and another 50 from Japan.

I hope we will get more new members to join in 2023/2024 for the ACT Hansa Class. We will see you at the next regatta.

2022/23 NSW Hansa Class Report.

We start by thanking Sailability Port Stephens for incorporating the NSW Hansa States within their clubs open event in late March. It was open to 2.3's & 303's only due to water levels at this club. There was very low winds with very high temperatures which really tested everyone but a minimum of three races were run & won in the 303 singles/ doubles & this eventually completed a series. Even though this was a small regatta there was some renewed & new interest shown to Hansa sailing.

The NSW liberty fleet have had some much needed upgrades so hopefully later in this year a NSW Hansa regatta may be held for these Liberty's as well as Skud 18's in the same waters. Still to be confirmed so news to come.

Hansa boats used almost exclusively by the sailability branches in NSW are being increasingly incorporated within mainstream events by Yacht Clubs/Sailing clubs & recognised by Australia Sailing more & more. This is a Slow process but positive thanks to the inclusion push. Some examples would be at Manly were a couple of events have happened together including a She Sails event . Dobroyd are regularly included with in mainstream events & also having a positive Deaf Sailing program running with racing in mind. Batemans bay are recognised by the mainstream & included regularly in there Easter regatta, which shows some brilliant viewing.

Sailability branches throughout NSW have/are being included in local events more widely which I can only see as positive news for Hansa Class sailing as a whole.

We had hoped to spark some interest in racing with the other Sailability groups at the annual conference last year but although there is a couple of groups running small programs there was no interest in hosting any events.

Southport hosted the inaugural Virtus Para world Sailing Championships for athletes with an intellectual impairment. Problems with eligibility requirements kept numbers low but sailors from Australia New Zealand and America competed in 303 singles and doubles in blustery conditions. The last day saw all boats reefed with gust of 25kts during races but all boats managing to finish the courses, full credit to the tenacity of the sailors.

There is plenty of support from Sailability Gold Coast and Southport Yacht Club to host the 2024 Hansa nationals combined with the 2024 Asia pacific championships during the last week in August 2024.

Monday 26th – Thursday 29th for the 2.3, 303 & Liberty's and the Skuds Friday to Sunday. I would hope that he expression of interest will be submitted within the next couple of days.

As a bit of a trial run, we are going to hold the 2023 Queensland championships this year on the 2nd - 3^{rd September} for the 303s, doubles and liberty's.

Sailability GC sail their 2 Paine keel boats in the Inshore division at Hollywell as do the QPSA Skuds, several 303s are now racing in the off the beach division.

Thursday has been run as in informal training and race day, this will be more structured and a race series will begin after Easter.

The Queensland Para Sailing academy currently has 4 sailors sailing the Skuds regularly in the inshore division of Southport YC. Training for another skipper is commencing next week with hopes of him joining the fleet for the winter racing, leaving one boat available for another participant. Talks are being held with the New Zealand Skud team to host a cross Tasman cup, they also have 6 Skuds so the idea is for Australia to send our best 3 over to race and their best to then come over here.

Victorian Hansa Sailing National AGM Report.

2022-2023 Season

After winning our 5th Teams Trophy in a row, Victoria maintained momentum through the busiest winter/summer we have had in a while.

Docklands hosted 4 Winter Coaching Clinics with Mark Teasdale offering coaching both on and off water with some fun drills and lots of information shared and tested. Louis Patterson ran a short course series in the afternoon which created more fun. We had ~10 boats and several new faces at the clinics, two of which were interested in states but couldn't attend due to schedule clashes. The clinics were supported by Sailability Victoria who offset the boat charter fees and other costs. We are hoping to grow this program now that Sailability programs are running again.

Ballaarat Yacht Club ran another great state championship in very hot sunny weather and very little wind creating challenges for race management and sailors alike. Mark Teasdale ran his coaching clinic on Friday with the sailing delayed by too much breeze and a rules session favoured in the air-conditioned member's bar. Mark provided additional on water coaching on the Saturday. There were entries 18 in total – one more than 2022, 7 x 303 single, 3 x 303 double, 8 x Liberty – including 3 sailors from NSW, one from Tas and one from SA. For the second time in its 24-year history, the Victorian Championships did not have any 2.3 entries. 2.3 and 303 doubles are fleets to develop in 2023-2024 through the clinics.

The Hansa sailors of Victoria really appreciate the time and effort put in by Mark Teasdale that allows us to grow and develop as a fleet. Also thank you to Docklands and Ballarat for hosting our events this season and to Sailability Vic for the funding that has assisted with clinics and paid for 2/3 trailers to get to Tassie.

Louis is planning another Winter Short Course Series at Docklands Yacht Club and plans afoot for a 2.3 only event to celebrate 25 years of Hansa racing in Victoria as well as the 25th State Championships – venues to be confirmed.

The Victorian Hansa Sailing Facebook page continues to grow with 78 members – not just Victorians. The state rep email hansasailingvic@gmail.com centralises all contact and allows both reps access which streamlines communication which is working well.
